- 2. Junior members are permitted to play as follows:

Monday to Friday - at any time before 5.00pm and after 7.00 pm

- Saturday & Sunday after 11.00 am
- 3. Junior members in full-time employment may play at any time from Monday to Friday but only at the above times at weekends.
- 4. Junior members with a Handicap of 18 or less can play in the normal field in Club Monthly Medals when accompanied by an adult member in the group, where junior members wish to play as a group together they then must play at the back of the field, i.e. after the last group of Adult Members have commenced their round.
- 5. Junior Members are permitted to enter the Club Championship, however if they qualify then they must play in the Club Championship.

General

- 1. The game of golf shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club, St Andrews, subject to the local rules as laid down by the Club Council.
- 2. Players should make themselves conversant with the ETIQUETTE required in golf.
- 3. Avoid slow play and always keep up with group in front.
- 4. The course will be closed prior to play commencing for all competitions unless approved by the Greens or Fixtures Director.
- 5. Please Repair all Pitch Marks, Replace Your Divots and leave all Bunkers in a Tidy and Playable Condition.
- 6. Distance measuring devices which do not have direct access to the internet may be used in all competitions.
- 7. Members should please note that details of Junior Competitions, additional team matches, visiting parties and outings will be posted on the fixtures noticeboards and on the board at the professional's shop as well as within the online booking system.

Please Note:

- 1. The tee will be closed before the start time of all Competitions and all League Matches unless noted otherwise. Members should remember that when the tee is closed, players are not permitted to walk out to a further point of the course to commence play. The tee will reopen once players in the competitions/matches have left the second green.
- 2. Indicative times only are given for the end of ladies' competitions. Members should therefore check with the professional to ascertain tee time availability on ladies' competition days.
- 3. Should adverse weather conditions prevail during competitions, to the extent that it becomes impossible to complete a hole, or unsafe to continue play, a long single blast of a Klaxon Horn will be sounded to suspend play. In the event of a suspension, any ball in play must be marked where it lies in agreement with playing partners.
 The suspension will last for up to ONE HOUR. At the end of this period the competition will either recommence (One Klaxon blast), with players resuming their position, or it will be cancelled (Two Klaxon blasts). On resumption of play, if a marker cannot be located, agreement on place of play must be sought from a playing partner or official.
 During play or the suspension of play the course will be inspected, and members may use the backs of bunker rakes to clear any pools of water on greens.
 If the competition is cancelled, the course will be closed and all players MUST leave the course.
- 4. Work by Green Keeping Staff will not be suspended at any time during midweek play, including competitions. However, tee positions and pin placements will remain fixed for the duration of any competitions.
- 5. When a medal is on, this competition is open all day. Players can play in a medal after the last time on the medal sheet by signing in to the competition by using the PSI monitor.

Bye-Laws

Interpretation

All references, in these Bye-Laws, to a member or members shall mean also a reference to the Associate Members except where the text makes such interpretation inappropriate. In the event of any questions arising as to the meaning of any of the Bye-Laws, the Council shall be the sole judge.

The Clubhouse

- 1. The Clubhouse Lounges and dining Area are for the use of all Members.
- 2. Junior Members have access to the Main and 1905 lounges.
- 3. The supply of alcohol to the Club shall be under the control of the Council and no official or other person employed by the Club shall have any personal interest in the sale of the alcohol therein or the profits arising from such sales.
- 4. No alcohol shall be sold or supplied to any person under the age of 18 years.
- 5. Only food and drink supplied by the Club may be consumed in the Clubhouse, except by prior arrangement with the Council.
- 6. Dress Code: Members and Visitors using the Clubhouse must adhere to the dress code as stated below and as posted on the Club Noticeboards.
- 7. A reasonable standard of dress is required at all times.
- 8. Members must be smart and presentable at all times in both the Members Bar and the Lounge Bar.
- 9. Smart blue denim garments are permitted to be worn in the Clubhouse by any Member or Visitor.
- 10. Appropriate footwear must be worn. Trainers, if worn, must be clean and respectable.
- 11. No football / rugby shirts are to be worn in the Clubhouse.
- 12. In the Clubhouse, tailored shirts may be worn outside trousers.
- 13. No waterproofs are to be worn in both the 1905 Lounge and the Main Lounge / Restaurant.

The Course

- 1. The Captain of the Club shall have priority on the first tee.
- 2. Dress Code: Members and visitors using the course are asked to ensure that they conform to a good, neat and clean standard of dress and must adhere to the dress code as stated below and as posted on the Club noticeboards. The Course Ranger and the Professional will ensure that the dress code is observed.
- 3. The following must not be worn: T-shirts and sleeveless shirts (men only), vests and football or rugby tops, blue denim jeans, trousers with patches or holes.
- 4. Tailored crew/turtle neck golf shirts are not categorized as T-shirts and are acceptable. All other respect golf attire can be worn.
- 5. Golf Shirts can be left untucked if designed for playing golf.
- 6. Only tailored shorts/cargo shorts are acceptable and socks must be worn. Beach or football shorts are not acceptable.
- 7. Golf shoes must be worn. Juniors under secondary school age may wear trainers.
- 8. Mobile phones must be kept on 'silent' mode at all times on the Course. Making or receiving calls on the Course is prohibited except in an emergency situation.
- 9. Mats must be used during the winter period in accordance with instructions issued by the Council.

Matches and Competition

- 1. Junior members with a handicap of 18 or less can play in the Club Monthly medals.
- 2. Players may play individually, two balls, three balls and four balls. NO five balls or over are permitted on the course

Guests

- 1. Guests may be introduced to play on the Course by:
 - Junior Members at the times Junior Members are permitted to play on the Course. Junior times below)
 - Members introducing a Guest shall pay the green fees prescribed by the Council, prior to the commencement of play. In the event of the Professional's Shop being closed, the green fee ticket shall
 - be obtained from the Bar or Club Manager's Office. All guests' tickets must be visibly displayed on their bag.
 - Members shall not introduce more than three guests at any one time to play.
 - A Member and guest(s) introduced by that Member must play together. No guest, whether introduced by the same or another Member, shall be allowed to play on the Course more often than 3 times a month and 12 times a year.
 - All guests must produce their green fee receipt, on request, to any Official, Employee of the Club or Club Member.

Complaints

- 2. Members are reminded that they should ensure that their guests are properly dressed for both the course and clubhouse.
